Welcome to Wellbeing and Weaving Wellbeing (SSE)

We have introduced new Wellbeing Programmes throughout the school. Infants to 2nd Class are using the "Welcome to Wellbeing Programme" and 3rd to 6th Class are using the "Weaving Wellbeing Programme". Both programmes work to introduce the language of wellbeing, develop emotional awareness and emotional regulation skills which help to build resilience and coping strategies, develop awareness of their own strengths, develop helpful self-talk, develop social competence, self-compassion and self-worth. Literacy Stations 1st/2nd Class - Parent Volunteers (SSE)

Literacy Stations started in 1st/2nd class last week and are proving to be a very positive initiative. I would like to take this opportunity to thank the many parents that volunteered to help out with the reading station. Parent volunteering is something that was very successful in my previous school so I am very pleased to see that this addition has been so positively received by staff, parents and pupils alike. It is so important for children to see parents involved in education and working in partnership with school staff. We look forward to continuing with this.

Grandparents Day (SSE)

Grandparent's Day will return this year on Thursday 1st February 2024. We are looking forward to welcoming grandparents into the school to take part in lots of different activities. More information will follow closer to the time.

Class Communication Tools (SSE)

Each class teacher is now communicating with parents through their chosen communication tool. These include a class Facebook page, Class Dojo and Class Padlet. Teachers will be using these methods of communication to share the wonderful work that the children are doing with parents and as a result there will no longer be class sections in our Newsletters going forward.

Gaeilge Neamhfhoirmiúil

We have continued our work this year to improve our use of "Gaeilge Neamhfhoirmiúil" (informal Irish) throughout the school. The themes that have been covered so far have been Mé Féin, An Scoil, Bia agus Oíche Shamhna. This year we have introduced "Comhrá Ranga" which involves classes working together to practise their "frásaí na míosa" together. 5th and 6th class are working with 3rd and 4th class and infants are working with 1st and 2nd class. We have already noticed an improvement in the children's level of confidence when speaking Gaeilge and their willingness to give it a go has greatly improved! Maith sibh a pháistí!

Each month at Assembly a "Gaelgeoir na Míosa" award is presented to a pupil who the staff feel has gone above and beyond to use their Gaeilge Neamhfhoirmiúil. We have had one "Gaelgeoir na Míosa" so far this year. She has made a huge effort to use her Gaeilge throughout the day and to make conversations with the teachers on the yard and school corridors. School Uniform

The school uniform standard remains very high this year - many thanks to all parents for this. We want to continue with the high standard of school uniforms throughout the year. Please see below for a list of items included in our school uniform:

- Navy jumper with school crest
- Pale blue collared t-shirt or shirt with or without school crest
- Navy skirt/pinafore/trousers/tracksuit bottoms
- Navy shorts in warmer months

The following are not included in our school uniform:

- Branded items of clothing <u>clothes should not have logos such as adidas, nike etc.</u>
- Hoodies
- Jumpers/skirts/pinafores/trousers/bottoms/shorts that are not navy

In the colder winter months children may wish to bring an extra fleece/zip top into school to wear in the classroom over their uniform. If doing so please ensure that this top is navy in colour. This extra top should be in addition to a coat. Coats are not suitable for inside wear due to their bulky nature.

First Holy Communion and Confirmation


